

FOR OUR SICK




Pilgrims to the Holy Land with Emmaus on their wish list will find several places claiming to be the historic site. None have been confirmed. It's fitting that the original Emmaus remains elusive. Once the two disciples recognise Jesus in the breaking of bread, he vanishes from

sight. There's no geographic place, Luke's story suggests, which secures the presence of the Risen One. Rather, he's to be found wherever the community breaks bread in his memory.

The breaking of bread is one of the defining features of the Christian community. Luke made that clear last Sunday. It prompts the question: does the Emmaus story shed any light on how the breaking of bread might be well celebrated today? A few thoughts come to mind. First, Jesus joins the disciples as they are abandoning Jerusalem and all they hoped for. He does not remonstrate with them or lay down pre-conditions for being in his company. He seeks them out and meets them where they are at.

Secondly, as he breaks open the scriptures the hearts of the two disciples begin to burn within them. What a noble aim for all ministers of the word! To proclaim and explain the word so well that the flame of faith is kindled in the hearts of all present! And thirdly, might the breaking of bread be such an experience of communion that, like the Emmaus disciples, everyone is eager to share their joy?

ANZAC biscuits have become an iconic symbol of 25 April. But did you know that this humble bite was earlier known as a 'soldiers' biscuit'? While their origins date back to the 1820s, these sweet treats – made from common pantry staples like oats, sugar, flour, butter, golden syrup, and bicarb soda – were a

#### popular fundraiser during WWI.

With their simple recipe and long shelf life, the biscuits also became a 'go-to' for Australian families to send to men fighting on the front lines.


