

Five months after preaching at the funeral of his martyred friend Rutilio Grande, and less than three years before his own assassination, Archbishop (now St) Oscar Romero spoke thus of the prophet Jeremiah: "You heard today in the first reading

the accusations: 'Death to that Jeremiah! He's demoralising the soldiers and all of the people . . .' See how the accusations against the prophets of all times are the same. When the prophet bothers the consciences of the selfish, or of those who are not building with God's plans, he is a nuisance and must be eliminated, murdered, thrown into a pit, persecuted, not allowed to speak the word that annoys".

Both Grande and Romero followed in the footsteps of Jeremiah. Both took Jesus' words to heart. They refused to succumb to fear. They declared themselves for Christ before the might of earthly powers. Both paid the price.
