Alleluia, alleluia! Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; to God who is, who was, and who is to come . Alleluia!





Anyone under the illusion that Trinity Sunday is about an other-worldly doctrine needs only to consider the earth-shattering experience of Paul the apostle. More than once in his letters he boasts of his Jewish heritage. "I myself am an Israelite, a

descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin," he wrote in his letter to the Romans (11:1 NRSV). As such he would have prayed the Shema daily with deep devotion: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone" (Dt 6:4 NRSV).We can hardly imagine how seismic was his discovery that Jesus of Nazareth was the promised Messiah, in whom "the One God has acted climactically and decisively . . . even as Israel's Messiah. A shocking blinding reality. The reality that would change the world" (N.T. Wright. Paul, A Biography, NY: HarperCollins, 2020, 54). Famously Paul went on to write of "the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything . . ." (Phil 3:8). In time Paul understood more and more deeply how faith in Christ gave birth to life in the Spirit. His letters are a treasure trove of teaching about the work of the Spirit in individuals and cannot reclaim Paul's original communities alike. We experience for ourselves, but whenever we are greeted with

"the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit," we can feel solidarity with him.

SAFEGUARDING UPDATE

It is important that all Parishioners are aware of the importance and responsibility of our Volunteers to meet the Child safety requirements. This week I bring your attention to the requirement of a Working with Children Check.

All Safeguarding requirements are on the Archdiocese Website and the website of the Children's Guardian.

Office of the Children's Guardian regulates and oversees organisations in NSW because children and young people have the right to be safe.

The Archdiocese Safeguarding Office has been advised that Churches within the Archdiocese will be audited by the Office of the Children's Guardian this year.

It is the Church's obligation to participate in the audit but more importantly, we are required to meet the Regulations set down for Volunteers.

The first responsibility (among others) is to ensure that volunteers in certain Parish roles that DO require a WWCC, have one.

In our Parish the following roles are required to hold a WWCC which much be verified by the Parish:

Parish Secretaries, Sacramental Group Leaders, Catechists in State Schools, Acolytes and Senior Altar Servers, Ministers of the Work/Readers/Lectors, Parish Collectors and Eucharistic Minister.

If we do not meet the requirements of the Office of the Children's Guardian, the Priest and the Church will be fined and the amounts are substantial.

I urge any volunteer in the above categories that do not have a WWCC to immediately obtain one and forward a copy to the Parish Office. Please check that your WWCC has not expired, and you need to renew it. There is no cost associated with holding a WWCC and if you have any queries, please contact the Parish Office on a Tuesday and we will be able to answer your queries.

Join us for this year's 'Walk with Christ' annual Eucharistic Procession through the streets of Sydney to make a joyful public proclamation and act of worship towards the person of Jesus Christ (as King), and to invoke His blessing upon the city.

The presence of the Eucharist in this joyful liturgical act invokes the benevolent spiritual blessings of Christ onto the city and all who live there. The blessing is derived from He who has been "anointed to proclaim the good news to the poor ...to proclaim freedom for prisoners and sight to the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." It is in this way that the Walk with Christ is part of the spiritual and civic life of the city and Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney.

"Wherever it is possible in the judgement of the diocesan Bishop, a procession through the public streets should be held, especially on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ as a public witness of reverence for the Most Holy Sacrament, for the "devout participation of the faithful in the Eucharistic procession on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is a grace from the Lord which yearly fills with joy those who take part in it"
