

Alleluia, alleluia! You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation; announce the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Alleluia!





Jesus concludes his missionary discourse today without mentioning baptism, while Paul offers teaching on baptism without mentioning mission. Is there no connection between them? Pope Francis insists there is: "In virtue of their baptism, all the

members of the People of God have become missionary disciples (cf. Mt 28:19) . . . Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are 'disciples' and 'missionaries,' but rather that we are always 'missionary disciples.' If we are not convinced, let us look at those first disciples, who, immediately after encountering the gaze of Jesus, went forth to proclaim him joyfully: 'We have found the Messiah!' (Jn 1:41). The Samaritan woman became a missionary immediately after speaking with Jesus and many Samaritans came to believe in him 'because of the woman's testimony' (Jn 4:39). So too, Saint Paul, after his encounter with Jesus Christ, 'immediately proclaimed Jesus' (Acts 9:20; cf. 22:6-21). So, what are we waiting for?" (The Joy of the Gospel #120)

Please check that your WWCC has not expired, and you need to renew it. There is no cost associated with holding a WWCC and if you have any queries, please contact the Parish Office on a Tuesday and we will be able to answer your queries. On Thursday of Week 9 I attended a meeting of schools and other educational institutions from the Strathfield Municipality. This meeting was hosted by the Mayor of Strathfield, Karen Pensabene. The purpose of the meeting was to address concerns around traffic and road safety in our council area. The Strathfield Traffic Committee highlighted the fact that U-turns, 3-point turns, and

double parking are the practices that must be avoided near our school and every school. These are the things that cause the accidents. On the other hand, things like the traffic queues around schools are quite safe. They can be annoying, but they are safe.
