

THE ADVENT WREATH

Advent is the beginning of the Liturgical Year and is a time for anticipation, preparation, joy and hope. Within the four weeks of the Advent season, the Church's liturgy draws attention to different facets of how God's plan has been revealed in Christ, is now revealed in every Mass we celebrate, and that Christ will be revealed in his glory when he comes again at a time we do not know.



For each Sunday of Advent, we take our focus for the Advent Wreath from our Advent traditions. Like the people of the Old Testament, we live in hope for the fullness of the revelation of Christ the Messiah when he will come in glory to Jjudge the living and the dead.

The Advent Wreath Responsory often replaces the Penitential Act and therefore leads into the Opening Prayer.



SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY - 8TH DECEMBER

The 8th of December is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, the solemn dogma defined by Blessed Pope Pius IX in 1854. As Our Lady Immaculately Conceived is the patroness of the United States of America, this is a holy day of obligation in the United States. Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Blessed Pope Pius IX proclaimed on December 8, 1854: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin." —Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Each year in Term 4 our students from Year 2 through to Year 6 undertake achievement tests in Mathematics and Reading. These are known as PAT Tests. This stands for Progressive Achievement Tests and the assessments are designed by the Australian Council for Educational Research. These days the tests are online and adaptive. This means that if a student is having trouble, they will be asked easier items while a student who is succeeding will be presented with more difficult questions. These assessments are valuable because we get to know what students know and what they don't know. At Friday's assembly the students who came first, second or third in these tests received an award.



The Parents and Friends meeting this week highlighted the great contributions the P & F have made to our school this year financially and socially. As a result of the efforts of the P & F our school is a more engaging place for our students in the playground and in the classrooms. The students make use of the playground and sporting equipment every day and the teachers love the teaching and learning resources that have been provided.
