2ND SUNDAY OF LENT

The 2nd Sunday of Lent encourages obedience to God through the examples of Abraham and Jesus. Abraham's readiness to sacrifice Isaac and Jesus' submission to His Father's will during the Transfiguration both exemplify profound obedience rooted in trust and love.

On this Sunday, the mystery of the risen and glorified Christ seated at the right of the Father is anticipated. This is what happened in the mystery of the transfiguration which the Gospel presents: "To glory, through the cross." God gave his Son to die for us (2nd reading), but the Passion is the way that leads to Resurrection (Preface).

Thus, we have to live the mystery of the cross always, and especially during these days of Lent, full of hope that one day, if we are faithful to Christ and His Church till death, we will also resurrect. By participating in the Eucharist of the glorious body of Christ, we become partakers of the eternal goods of heaven.

Ronita is 22. She lives with her husband and two children in a barangay (local district) in Quezon City, which is situated in Metro Manila in the Philippines.



Ronita left school when she became pregnant as a teenager. This could have had a life-long impact on her ability to find work and provide for her family but, thankfully, she heard about the Alternative Learning System (ALS) program run by the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ), Caritas Australia's local partners in the Philippines.

Through the FCJ, Ronita was able to re-enrol in her studies and continue learning in a safe and flexible environment – even with the arrival of her second child.

After completing her ALS classes, Ronita went on to earn her Grade 12 Senior High School Diploma. With her new diploma, Ronita has now secured a job at a call centre and is looking to a brighter future for her whole family. "I have now graduated senior school and I am so proud of myself," she said. "I feel hopeful for the future... Now it's not impossible for me to achieve my dream... Thank you."


