

We can thank the Corinthians' rather chaotic community life, with its factions, charisms and questions, for provoking Paul to write at some length to them. One of the issues he has to reprimand and educate them about was table

fellowship. Sadly, much of his teaching on this subject in 1 Corinthians 11:17-34 is never heard on a Sunday. Paul upbraids them for betraying the import of the Lord's Supper. Rivalries abound, wealth and status divide the members, and sharing is shoved aside by selfishness and indulgence. What should have been a powerful display of equality, mutuality and selflessness had become the opposite. The Corinthians are failing to honour the Body of Christ. It didn't take long for the early Church to separate the Lord's Supper from the common meal, and this is what we have inherited. Our issues may be different, but Paul's critique still has bite. **Source Liturgy Bris**



# **ASH WEDNESDAY – 14 FEBRUARY 2024**



The Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February 2024.

This a day of Fasting and Abstinence.

Mass times and Distribution of Ashes are 9.15 am (St Anne's school attending) and 6.30 pm.

The act of putting on ashes symbolizes fragility and mortality, and the need to be redeemed by the mercy of God. Far from being a merely external act, the Church has retained the use of ashes to symbolize that attitude of internal penance to which all the baptized are called during Lent. —Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting (one main meal and two snacks) and abstinence (not eating meat). Fasting applies to those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year; the law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year.




# **LENT**

The Safeguarding Office has released its Induction and Refresher zoom training meetings for Safeguarding for 2024. It is highly recommended that you attend the first zoom meeting for the year which is as follows:

1. Induction Training: Tuesday 20 February 2024 from 9.00am to 10.00am

Induction Training is for all volunteers who have not previously

done any Safeguarding Training.

2. Refresher Training: Tuesday 27 February 2024 from 9.00am to 10.00am

Refresher Training is for those volunteers who have previously completed the Induction Training three or more years ago. It

must be renewed.

To register for Zoom training you need to email <u>safeguardingtraining@sydneycatholic.org</u> and advise them you will be participating in their Training and they will reply with the zoom link.

If you are not confident in doing the zoom training from your own computer or do not know how to download the zoom app on the computer and would like to complete the training by zoom rather than online please email the parish office or phone the parish office on a Tuesday and Janelle will register you and then you can participate in the zoom session at the Parish Office on the 20 February or 27 February. As Safeguarding Training is mandatory for all volunteers, please take this opportunity to complete this requirement.
