3RD SUNDAY OF LENT

The readings for the 3rd Sunday of Lent Year B help us understand that we must follow God's commandments and truly live them in our hearts to find life. The first reading gives us the Ten Commandments. The second reading reminds us that God's wisdom is not like human wisdom. And the gospel tells of Jesus cleansing the temple of the money changers who put their own desires above serving the Father.

APPLYING THE GOSPEL TO DAILY LIFE:



The cleansing of the temple by Jesus serves as powerful metaphor for personal transformation. Reflect on what "merchants and money changers" exist within your own heart

and mind—these could be sinful habits, selfish desires, or anything that keeps you from God. Consider how you can "cleanse your temple" this Lent. What steps can you take to eliminate these distractions or impurities? This might involve seeking reconciliation through Confession, engaging in spiritual reading, or dedicating time for silent meditation. How can such actions help purify your intentions and align your will more closely with God's?

Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme hardship as a result.



Leaia lives with her five children, husband, brother and sister-in-law on the island of Upolu in Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of clean water caused Leaia a lot of worry.

Their home is not connected to a piped water system, so they had to rely solely on rainwater collected in old fridges. When their water ran out, Leaia had to walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street.


With the support of Caritas Australia's local partner, Caritas Samoa, a water tank was installed at Leaia's home. She and her family now have a steady supply of clean drinking water at home. Next year, they will also have a toilet built, with the support of Caritas Samoa, which will further improve their health and living conditions.

We have welcomed our new chickens for 2024. The incubator arrived on February 19, and we now have fifteen chicks – Schnitzel, Nugget and thirteen friends. Over time the numbers of roosters and hens will become evident. At about fifteen weeks of age the roosters begin to become noisy. It is then time for them to go back to the farm at Horsley Park. In most councils in Sydney roosters are not permitted because they are a nuisance at 3 o'clock in the morning. The hens begin laying at about twenty or twenty-two weeks of age.

On Monday morning our Year 5 and 6 students and teachers leave for Canberra at 6am. Among the highlights of the excursion are visits to Parliament House, the War Memorial, The Royal Australian Mint and Questacon. We return, via McDonalds at Sutton Forest, on Tuesday evening.

On Wednesday evening, the St Anne's team were again responsible for the Vinnies Night Patrol to Liverpool and Sadlier Miller. I am very pleased to report that this was a magnificent team effort between parishioners, parents and carers and staff. Thank you to everyone involved.


