SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM: FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

First Holy Communion in our Parish will be celebrated at St Anne's Church on Sunday, 2 June at 12.00 pm. Preparation classes will commence on Sunday 5 May 2024. The program will be broken into three weekly sessions commencing at 9.00 am on:

> Sunday, 5 May (Lessons 1 and 2); Sunday, 12 May (Lesson 3); and Sunday, 19 May (Lesson 4).

There will be a compulsory practice session at 4 pm on Saturday, 25 May followed by 5 pm Mass for those who are able to attend.

At each session, the child and parent/carer will discuss the Sacrament of First Holy Communion by working through the workbook.

Mass attendance during the program is required as the Sacraments are an initiation into the Church and one of the basic features of our faith is that we gather together on Sundays for Mass.
